The nearest stop to the site is Wimbledon Theatre, which is on The Broadway almost directly outside. This stop is served by several bus routes including the 57 towards Clapham Park and Kingston, 93 towards North Cheam and Putney Bridge, 131 towards Tooting Broadway and Kingston, and 219 towards Clapham Junction.

Buses also depart from Wimbledon Station towards Vauxhall, Morden, Sutton, Mitcham and Raynes Park.

By Tube

Wimbledon is at the end of the branch of the District Line. Trains depart every 10 minutes towards Central London with journey time to London Victoria of around 25 minutes.

There is Cycle Parking available for 45 Bikes at NHS Sutton and Merton HQ, plus locker and shower facilities.

The Trust operates a cycle to work scheme (called Cyclescheme). The scheme allows employees to buy a bicycle and safety equipment through a salary sacrifice arrangement. This means you can save up to 40% on the cost of a new bicycle and equipment. Further details of the scheme can be accessed through www.cyclescheme.co.uk/b587d.

There are various cycle routes running through Wimbledon Town Centre. Although the Broadway is not a recognised cycle route, the parallel South Park Road is signed for cyclists and Trinity Road and Montague Road are recommended cycling routes.

By Train 🗐

The nearest station is Wimbledon, located 5 minutes walk along The Broadway. Wimbledon Station provides excellent connections to a number of stations in South West London and Surrey. Trains depart for London Waterloo approximately every 5 minutes at peak times, with a journey time of 17 minutes. Other stations served by direct trains from Wimbledon include Clapham Junction (7 minutes), Kingston (12 minutes), Sutton (18 minutes) and Guildford (46 minutes).

Wimbledon Station is serviced by a taxi rank and has a 40 space car park. There are also 86 covered cycle parking spaces at the station.

Wimbledon Station is also served by the London Tramlink. The tram calls at all stations to West and East Croydon, then on to New Addington. The trams depart every 7 minutes at peak times.

Carbon Management Programme

NHS Sutton and Merton is continually striving to better understand and lessen its environmental impact. In July 2009 the Trust responded to the recommendations of the NHS Carbon Reduction Strategy 'Saving Carbon, Improving Health' by appointing Support Services Partnership South West London (SSP), to develop their Carbon Management Programme. This is driven through a Sustainable Development Management Plan, which details carbon strategy, policy and action plans for measuring and reducing emissions across ten activity areas including procurement, building design and travel. You can keep up-to-date with carbon issues affecting NHS Sutton and Merton through the electronic publication 'Carbon Matters'.

Travel and transport is a key area which accounts for 18% of the entire NHS Carbon Footprint, equivalent to 3.24 millions tonnes of CO₂. NHS Sutton and Merton have therefore set this as one of their priority areas for carbon measurement and reduction. Staff travel habits have been captured through a survey which will be repeated annually, with the results being used in carbon footprint calculations and to help inform Trust Travel Planning.
